Home Zone

The Description of the Home Zone:

Starting at Carrington Road, travel east along the north-western motorway continuing past the Western Springs off ramp and Newton Road exit. Travel south along Symonds Street (both sides) and turn into Mt Eden Road. Follow Mt Eden Road then turn into Landscape Road (both sides), cross Dominion Road at numbers 886/815 (included) and continue along Invermay Avenue (both sides) and Renfrew Avenue. Travel north-western along Mt Albert Road from 310 and 303. Turn southwest into Sandringham Road extension (both sides) then northwest along Stoddard Road. Follow Richardson Road and along Woodward Road, down to Phyllis Street and along Carrington Road to the starting point.

All residential addresses on included sides of boundary roads and all no exit roads off included sides of boundary roads are included within the zone unless otherwise stated.

All students who live within the home zone described above shall be entitled to enrol at the school.

Out of Zone Enrolments

Each year the Board of Trustees will determine the number of places that are likely to be available in the following year for the enrolment of students who live outside the home zone. The Board will publish this information by notice in a daily or community newspaper circulating in the local area. The notice will indicate how applications are to be made and will specify a date by which all applications must be received.

Applications for enrolments will be processed in the following order of priority:

First Priority *This priority is not applicable as this school does not run a special programme approved by the Secretary for Education.*

Second Priority will be given to applicants who are siblings of current students.

Third Priority will be given to applicants who are siblings of former students.

Fourth Priority will be given to an applicant who is a child of a former student of the school.

Fifth Priority will be given to any applicants who are children of board employees.

Sixth Priority will be given to all other applicants.

If there are more applicants in the first, second, third, fourth or fifth priority groups than there are places available, selection within the priority group will be by ballot conducted in accordance with instructions by the Secretary under Section 11G(1) of the Education Act 1989. Parents will be informed of the date of any ballot by notice in a daily or community newspaper circulating in the area served by the school.

Students seeking second or third priority status may be required to give proof of sibling relationship.
