### **Another Albertian Centenarian**



Congratulations to Professor Russell Stone, who celebrated his 100th birthday on Friday, April 7.

Professor Stone attended Mount Albert Grammar from 1936 to 1940 and was heavily involved in the life of the school.

He then studied at Auckland University College (now the University of Auckland), gaining a BA in 1945 and an MA with first class honours in 1949. He taught in secondary schools until he was appointed to the staff of the University of Auckland History Department in 1964 where he completed his PhD in History for his thesis on Auckland Business and

Businessmen in the 1880s.

When he retired in 1989 he was given the title of Emeritus Professor. He has continued his research and is considered an authority of the history of early Auckland and on the life of Sir John Logan Campbell.

Professor Stone wrote the history of the school for the 75th jubilee. *Tradition and Change: Mount Albert Grammar School: The First Seventy-Five Years* was published in 1997 and



covers the first 75 years of the school. In addition, it reflects the changes in Auckland society over that period. He was inducted into the Mount Albert Grammar School Hall of Distinction in 2000, and in the 2002 New Year's Honours list he was appointed an Officer of the New Zealand Order of Merit for services to historical research. Professor Stone has been an active. member of the school's alumni associations - the Old Boys' Association and (since 2002) the Albertians Association, regularly attending functions and as a sounding board on matters of school history. Recently, he offered advice on the new history of the school Change and Tradition, which was published to mark the centenary. In September last year he assisted in planting the Centennial Tree.

Another Albertian centenarian is George Clark, pictured with daughter and former Prime Minister Helen Clark. George attended Mount Albert Grammar from 1936 to 1938. He celebrated his 101st birthday on March 8.

### Two golds at Waka Ama Nationals



MAGS had a strong presence at the Waka Ama Nationals in Rotorua, with entrants in the following events: J19 Mixed W12, J19 Men's 500m, J19 Men's 250m, J19 Men's W1 250, J16 Women's W1 250m.

There was fierce competition with 108 schools entered, some with long-established and strong Waka Ama programmes.



A girls team joined with the MAGS boys to enter the Mixed W12 race. MAGS won its heat and went straight to the Championship semifinals where they showed real determination to place in the top 3 and would have qualified for the final but for being disqualified due to a technicality.

Marnie Toloa (pictured above right at centre) competed in the W1 category, winning her heat and, based on her time, gaining a spot in the Championship semis. She won her semi and entered the final as fastest qualifier.

Marnie had a quick start and the strength and fitness to hold off the chasers and win the gold medal, the first medal winner for MAGS at a waka ama nationals event.

Following his sister, Marlin Toloa entered the boys W1 J19 event, as an U16 paddler, to challenge himself further. Marlin's heat time was fast enough to earn a Championship semi, which he won to make the final.

Marlin's explosive start meant he was ahead of the field after about 50m, and he maintained his composure and canoe speed to hold off a very fast field to take out the U19 Men's championship.

It is believed to be the first time siblings have held current National Waka Ama Championship status.

Following that, MAGS competed in Men's U19 teams events in the 500m (turn event) and the 250m sprint, making it through the heats and semifinals and earning a place in both Championship finals.

The boys put it all together for two personal best races but missed out on the medals, with a 5th place and 8th place – but this was a significant achievement on the national stage.

#### **Archers in Trans Tasman win**

Three MAGS archers were part of the New Zealand youth archery team that won the Trans Tasman Challenge in Adelaide over the April school holidays. Nick Lees, Year 13, Phoebe Newcombe, Year 11, and Lily Brislen, captain of the MAGS archery team as a Year 13 in 2022, joined 14 other youth archers from across New Zealand in the four-day tournament against Australia in the Adelaide Hills.

Despite being the coldest Easter
Adelaide had seen in 30 years, the New
Zealand team overcame the weather to
triumph with 70 points to Australia's 50.
This was a back-to-back win for the New
Zealand team, after winning the last



Challenge which was held in Auckland in 2019.

The next Challenge will be hosted in New Zealand in 2025, with all three Albertians hoping to represent New Zealand once again and successfully defend the trophy.

Orienteering Boys' seven-year winning streak



Last weekend MAGS took a team of 30 Orienteers to Wanganui for the North Islands Secondary Schools Orienteering Championships.

The Boys came away with a resounding win (for the seventh year in a row), beating Auckland Grammar by 193 points, which is a record winning margin.

The Girls (hindered by late Covid misfortune) finished third for the fourth year running, beating Diocesan by 50 points.

There were some stand-out performances, especially in the Junior Grades where all five new Juniors performed incredibly well.

Tahi Harris won the Sprint and Long in the Junior Boys as well as winning the

Zara Bint had an outstanding debut in the Junior Girls, finishing 5th in the Sprint and 2nd in the Long.

James Milne, with a strong Sprint finishing 3rd, was part of the Intermediate Boys team (with Reuben Adye and William Wood), which finished 2nd in the Relay. Izzy Spritzer had a fantastic Long to finish 4th.

Also on the weekend, the selection committee picked the Junior Boys for the upcoming World Schools event in Rio de Janeiro.

The team is Reuben Bruce, Victor Coen, Tahi Harris, Charlie Milne, Jack Trowsdale and William Wood, with Caleb Green as Reserve.
