

Online learning during Alert Level 4

Online learning for all year levels is in place for the foreseeable future. The <u>timetable structure</u> (as pictured) applies to all Year Levels 9-13.

Again, students will follow their actual school timetable each day but for the shorter periods indicated. Please note that, while classes finish at 1.00pm, after lunch students are expected to use the afternoon to complete their work and participate in other activities as per the examples given.

Please note that there is a limited number of free tutors, so it may not always be possible



New NCEA and Scholarship exam dates

The dates for the end of year NCEA and NZ Scholarship exams will be delayed by two weeks. They will now run from **Monday, November 22 until Tuesday, December 14**

inclusive.


- Due dates for portfolio submissions will also be moved the relevant subject teachers will be in communication regarding the specific change of dates.
- The Mathematics Common Assessment Task (MCAT) and Digital Technologies Common Assessment Tasks (DigiCATs) will be moved. Confirmation of specific dates will be shared with all relevant students as arrangements are finalised within the next week.

At this point, these are the only confirmed changes, however as the length of time that we are likely to remain in lockdown becomes clearer, extra steps may be taken such as reintroducing Learning Recognition Credits, or making changes to the thresholds of Endorsement and University Entrance.

If, and when, any further changes are confirmed, we will be sure to communicate this information with you.

NZQA and the Ministry of Education are working to ensure students will have a fair opportunity to gain NCEA, despite the disruption caused at the moment.


Out-of-zone applications close soon
