## A Right to be Safe at MAGS

Yesterday, the school engaged NZ Detector Dogs to carry out an inspection of our school to ensure our learning environment is drug-free and safe for every MAGS student.

The inspection of the school site complements our 'in-school'

programmes, which provide information and guidance to students about making good life choices regarding their health and well-being.

The strong, supportive message sent yesterday to our students contrasted with the release of disturbing annual suicide statistics in New Zealand. That an increasing number of Kiwis are unable to successfully navigate their way through challenging periods in their lives will be of deep concern to all New Zealanders – particularly parents and educators.

The impact of drugs and alcohol on the mental health of young people cannot be underestimated. We want to grow resilient students who can face the normal challenges of life. We want them to engage in healthy coping strategies that build confidence and hope. Furthermore, we need to reinforce the idea that asking for help during times of struggle shows a strength of character.

Trying to mask and withdraw from these challenges through substance abuse must never be a solution.

Our students are facing many mixed messages about the appropriateness of drug-use in our communities but please be assured that the message at MAGS is clear: drugs and learning will never be compatible!

Despite the current hesitation of our political leaders, MAGS will continue to take a lead in protecting the immense potential of our young people.

#### Geographers win four in a row

MAGS' Geography teams have successfully defended their Auckland quiz titles for the third successive time.

On August 13, St Cuthbert's hosted the Auckland regional round of the National Maatangi Whenua Year 11 Geography competition. Twenty teams from across the region competed in a range of rounds covering topics such as Geography in the news, map and modelling skills, New Zealand and general geographic knowledge. The much-coveted trophy has been won by MAGS for the past three years and so there was stiff competition from other schools wanting the honour of taking it from us.

One of the MAGS teams consisting of Melissa Barnes, Olivia Moody and Bohemia Schollum finished a commendable fifth while scoring the highest mark in the map round. However, it was our team of (pictured below, from left) Caleb Hall, Hamish MacGibbon and Ben Merlini that won the competition – a massive 13 points ahead of second-placed St Mary's, securing the title for the fourth successive year for MAGS.

On August 21, the AGTA Senior inter-school quiz for Year 12 and Year 13 Geography students again had MAGS as three-times champions and the other schools itching to take the title. It was to be a close competition between the 23 teams.

Our Year 13 team consisting of Jack Cavanagh, Matthew Ray, Lilly McCarthy and Amy Barker, many of them quiz novices, finished seventh-equal.

In previous years, the MAGS Year 12 teams had gone to this competition to get practice and experience for the following year.

However, this year's team of Aidan Skinner, Freeman McCall, Ben Batchelor-Cook and Samantha Persson finished four points ahead of a strong Takapuna Grammar side and the trophy returned to MAGS in an unprecedented four-title winning streak.

Geography teacher Donna Hobbs said, "We are already looking forward to defending our titles again next year."



Winter Tournament Week



Winter Tournament Week is upon us, and MAGS has 15 teams competing across 10 sports.

Five Basketball teams are in action – Junior Boys A & B, Junior Girls, and Premier Boys and Girls – and they are all playing at Pulman Arena, Takanini.

Also playing out at Takanini are the Lacrosse Premier Girls, with their games at Pulman Park. The Rugby League 1st XIII were scheduled to play at Pulman Park also but there competition has been cancelled due to worries about the spread of measles.

The UNISS Tournament for our Netball Premiers takes place at North Harbour Netball Centre.

The NZSS Climbing Championships get underway next week at Rocktopia climbing centre in Mt Maunganui.

The Rugby U15s travel to Napier for their tournament, while the NZSS Olympic Weightlifting is being held in Wellington this weekend.

Last Wednesday, MAGS had four teams of junior mathematicians participate in the annual Auckland Mathex competition at Barfoot & Thompson Stadium in Kohimarama.

Our Year 9 A team (Anatol Coen, Jay McElwee, Matthew Radcliffe and Jules Webb) placed seventh out of 126 teams. They reached the maximum score of 100 in about 22 minutes, a few minutes off placing in the top three.

Our other Year 9 team (Tabitha Freeman, Ella Graves, Emil Hinchliff and Shrey Patel) scored 85 points.

Both our Year 10 teams scored 100 points.

Our boys team (Sai Ashamagari, Josh D'arth, Devendra Johnston and Sam Taylor Sinclair) were actually leading at the 65-point mark but got stuck on one question and ended up placing 12th out of around 120 teams. They reached 100 points in 24 minutes.

Our girls team (Yasmin Lakeman, Sam Pullen, Olivia Wakelin and Vivienne Wong) got to 100 points just a few minutes later.

# Sports update

### **Orienteering Boys top nationwide**



Another amazing effort from the Orienteering Boys team, who successfully defended the Top Boys Secondary School Trophy at the NZSS Orienteering Championships held last weekend in Auckland.

This year, the Girls team joined them on the podium for the first time, placing third in the Top Girls Secondary School competition.

In the Relays, MAGS Boys were National Champions in the Senior, Intermediate and Junior Boys grades, with MAGS' second Senior Boys relay team winning Silver.

In the Girls Relays, for the first time ever MAGS had a podium placing with the Junior Girls Relay team gaining Silver.

In the Long Distance, Mitchell Cooper was second in Senior Boys, and Jay McElwee third in Junior Boys.

In the Sprint Distance, Luke Clements was first in Intermediate Boys, and Jay McElwee third in Junior Boys.

MAGS Orienteering team is managed by Neill McGowan with coaching from Albertian and New Zealand representative Kieran Woods.

Five MAGS students (Adam Bateman, Mitchell Cooper, Luke Clements, Sam Taylor Sinclair and Daniel Wood) have been selected for the New Zealand Schools team to compete in Australia later this year.



Congratulations to the MAGS Rugby Girls 10s on winning back-to-back titles in the Auckland Secondary Schools Competition, and going through another season undefeated. The Girls beat Howick College 58-12 in the final at Orakei Domain last weekend.

# **Swimmers at World Champs**



MAGS had two swimmers at the FINA World Junior Championships in Budapest, with Brearna Crawford representing New Zealand and Bede Aitu the Cook Islands.

Bede swam personal best times – and set Cook Islands records – in the 50m Backstroke and the 100m Backstroke during the heats but did not make the finals.

Swim Coach Paul Kent, who was part of the NZ team, said, "Brearna worked extremely hard in her preparation for the World Junior Championships and sometimes things pop up that test your character, and the outcomes don't always go the way you had hoped for or dreamed about.

"Bre fought hard to find her form and she should feel very proud of the resilience and work ethic that she displayed while representing her country. Bre is back in the pool and refocused on performing well for MAGS at the NZ Secondary School Swimming and NZ Short Course Championships over the coming weeks."

Her results at the championships were: 21st/64 - 50M Breast, 24th/70 - 100m Breast, 24th/60 - 200m Breast.

Albertians playing college basketball




Three of our talented 2018 Year 13 Premier Basketball Girls have been signed to colleges in the United States.
