#### FIRST X1, 2022





Tēnā koutou, e te whānau o Mount Albert Grammar School.

In the summer of 1922, our earliest MAGS cricketers (pictured top) took the field for the first time to represent their new school against a King's College XI.

The lack of suitable sports grounds at the newly opened Mount Albert Grammar

School necessitated this fixture being played away at King's College. The game itself was a relatively low-scoring affair, with Kings dismissed for 43 runs chasing a modest 98 set by MAGS.

More importantly, that first game (and victory) began a legacy of 100 years of cricket at MAGS – one which was celebrated in the most fitting way last Saturday when our 2022 Boys 1st XI Cricket team claimed the Auckland Premier Championship with a victory over Saint Kentigern College on our home wicket.

This title has special meaning in our centenary year. It is also testament to the resilience of a number of senior players who have faced the disappointment of being losing finalists in previous years. Their hard work and persistence has finally borne fruit!

And then there is the special staff member who has walked the journey with MAGS cricketers since 2003.

Our Director of Cricket and 1st XI Coach Tony Sail is in his 20th and final year of coaching the premier boys side. He is stepping down as coach from next year, making Saturday's victory one to savour for Tony as much as for the players!

Congratulations to our Premier Boys Cricket Team and to Tony Sail – Auckland Champions 2022!

Boys 1st XI to contest national title



On Saturday, MAGS beat St Kentigern in the final of the Auckland Secondary Schools Cricket Championship for the Maryatt Cup and won the right to attend the Gillette Cup as Auckland Champions.

Director of Cricket Tony Sail reports, "After an horrendous week of thunderstorms and periods of torrential rain, curator Paul Le Clerc miraculously presented both captains with a fair and even pitch. The St Kents captain called correctly and inserted the MAGS XI.

"Some steady bowling and catching reduced MAGS to 31/4 with none of the top four reaching double figures. The middle order of Ohm Patel (30) Wesley Donald (38) and Ryan Krige (37) showed the situational awareness and positivity required to apply some pressure to the St Kents' fielding group, before they got out and exposed the lower order, leaving 5 overs of the 50 unused, and a total of 148 on the board.

"While the total appeared well below par, there was an air of confidence and self-belief among the team at the break which has been a hallmark of the MAGS 1st XI 2022.

"Their confidence proved well-placed when St Kents lost their 3rd wicket at 41 after a pedestrian start under the spell of all of the MAGS bowlers, backed by superb fielding.



"They then proceeded to lose their next 7 wickets for only 52 runs. Harrison Wills 4/13 (10 overs), Malay Patel 1/16 (10 overs), Priyam Mistry 2/10 (7 overs) and Aryan Nigudkar 1/10 (5 overs) were the wicket-takers with two run-outs in a fine supporting display from 'keeper Toby Naish.

"The outcome, an emphatic victory by 56 runs and deserved Auckland Champions 2022 and holders of the Maryatt Cup."

The team will now travel to The NZ Cricket High Performance Centre (Lincoln, Christchurch) to contest the Gillette Cup with five other teams representing each major association in the country.

Their fixtures are as follows: 13th December vs. Christ College, 14th December vs. Otago Boys High School, 15th December vs. Hutt International Boys School, 17th December vs. Tauranga Boys College, 18th December vs. Napier Boys High.

## Sylvia Brunt presented with Black Cap



Albertian Sylvia Brunt (2017-21) was presented with her Black Cap at assembly today, and Year 9s performed a haka in her honour.

Sylvia was part of the Black Ferns squad that recently won the Women's Rugby World Cup on home soil.

This year, at just 18, she made her Black Ferns debut off the bench against Canada in the Pacific Four Series in Waitākere.

At MAGS, she was the captain of the 1st XV Girls' team that won the College Sport Auckland Championship.
An impressive midfielder, she plays for the Auckland Storm and the Blues in Super Rugby Aupiki.




## Donate your unwanted calculator

They can then be lent out to students in years 11-13 for whom the cost might be challenging or to those who have lost or forgotten theirs for tests and exams.


Calculators can be dropped off at the Student Centre at any time in the next few weeks.
