Staff awards wrap up the school year



Associate Principal Jo Williams was one of the recipients of the CP Liddell Staff Awards presented by Chris Liddell.

Prior to the Staff Christmas Brunch today, there was one final meeting in the staffroom for the presentation of awards to some of our well-deserving and hard-working teaching and support staff.

It was also a time to recognise some of our long-serving staff such as Brian Murphy, who has been at MAGS for 63 years apart from a brief stint in Canada.

Mr Murphy, pictured right, started at MAGS as a Science and Biology teacher in 1960, and

over the years he has taught Chemistry, been responsible for Junior Science, worked as a teacher-librarian and a school counsellor before becoming the school's Archivist in 1999.

Mr Murphy is finally retiring – although he insists he still has some work to finish.

His colleague Mr Cave, who now works as our Assistant Archivist after 'retiring' a few years ago, was also recognised for his 50 years of service to MAGS.

Our Academic Dean Mr Gibbs, who has also clocked up 50 years at MAGS, paid tribute to Mr Cave, who came to teach at MAGS in 1974 after being a student here from 1964-68.

His connections to MAGS begin back in 1923, when his

father started as a pupil. Mr Cave's sons attended MAGS in the 1980s.

In his time teaching, Mr Cave, pictured below left with Mr Drumm, has taught eight different subjects – with a focus on Languages and Classics – and coached or managed five



different sports as well as managing the debating team.

When it came to the staff awards, these were read out by Mr Drumm and presented by our BoT chair Catherine Murphy, BoT member Greg Moyle and Albertian Chris Liddell.

PA to the Headmaster Annemarie Wright and English teacher Reuben Ploeg were named as the winners of the Herb Towers Staff Award for a professional development trip overseas. This award recognises outstanding service to MAGS.

Director of Boarding Daryl Cartwright and Year 11 Dean and Health and PE teacher Nik Coghill, who, of course, was coaching a sports team and couldn't be at the awards. These awards recognise staff who have been exceptional in supporting the school's mentoring programme.




Homestay families required

MAGS is still looking for more wonderful families, as we have a large number of International students starting in 2024. This is a great opportunity to learn about a different culture and build lasting friendships.

Our next student intake will be for Term 1, 2024. We will have short- and long-term students, staying for between 10 weeks to a full year. Homestay families are our most popular choice of accommodation as our students benefit from living with an English-speaking family and sharing in the New Zealand family experience.

What are the expectations of a host family?

A host family is expected to provide a clean and comfortable bedroom with a bed, a wardrobe (built-in or freestanding) and drawers, linen and towels, a desk and a lamp and three meals a day.



The application process:

The application process involves police vetting for all family members over 18 years. This is followed by a home visit from the school. This helps us to know a little more about your family's interests and lifestyle and enables us to make a well-informed student match.
