Year 9s had the school to themselves on Tuesday as they enjoyed their first day at school and were introduced to the MAGS Way.

They, along with the school's new staff, were welcomed with a powhiri in the hall.

Headmaster Patrick Drumm, pictured right, told the students that the school had high expectations of them, which revolved around respect and diligence. He reassured the assembled parents that while the school was on the way to being the biggest in the country, it was fully staffed, with quality staff despite other schools struggling to attract talent. The 600 new entrants were assigned to



their form classes and teachers, and met their Year 13 Peer Support Leaders, who spent the rest of the day helping students to get to know the layout of the school and what was expected of them. The Peer Support Leaders also conducted activities for the Year 9s to help them to break the ice with their classmates.

The Year 9s were back in the hall later in the day to practise the School Hymn, and to have the school's standards reinforced.

The full school was in on Wednesday with form classes assigned and assemblies for the various year levels.

Mount Albert Grammar School has welcomed new Deputy Principals Tanya Rose and Corey Todd to the ranks of the Senior Leadership Team.

Ms Rose joined MAGS in 2018, having worked in education for 19 years. She started her career as a primary teacher, having trained in New Zealand, and then moved to London where she spent 17 years working in secondary schools.

During her time in London she progressed from a Mathematics teacher to Head of Maths in a large central London School. She then moved into Senior Leadership and was an Assistant Head Teacher at Ursuline High School for three years prior to returning to New Zealand.

Ms Rose had the responsibility of Exams Co-ordination at MAGS, and was made Head of Mathematics before assuming the Deputy Principal role.

Mr Todd joined MAGS this year from Massey High School, where he was Assistant Principal, overseeing Behaviour, Attendance and the Pastoral System.

He is a Physical Education and Health teacher, and completed his Masters in Education through University of Auckland. He previously taught at Onehunga High School where he was HOD of Physical Education & Health. He has coached school basketball and cricket teams.

Mr Todd and his wife have two children.

Swimming success in Aussie

MAGS swimmers Brearna Crawford and Edie Ancell enjoyed success as part of the Auckland team that competed at the Victorian State Championships over the summer holidays.

Brearna swam times good enough to qualify for this year's World Junior Championships in two events but needs to repeat those performances at the NZ Age Groups Champs in April to be selected. She broke two 15yrs NZ records, two Auckland Open records, four Auckland 15yrs records, and won three Gold (100m and 200m Breaststroke, 100m Fly), two Silver (50m Free, 4 x50m IM Relay) and three Bronze (200m and 400m IM, 4 x 100m IM Relay) medals.

Edie won a Silver (4 x50m IM Relay) and a Bronze (4 x 100m IM Relay). Both girls swam all personal best times at the age group meet.

Charlie Morton third in Tanner Cup

Congratulations to Year 10 student Charlie Morton, who finished third overall at the Tanner Cup held in Evans Bay, Wellington in early January.

He was one of five sailors representing Auckland to sail against the best P Class sailors selected from around New Zealand.

The Tanner Cup was raced In true windy Wellington conditions and was a hard-fought regatta in the ever-competitive P Class sailing, which has produced many champion sailors over the years.



Adobe Creative Cloud 2019 Subscriptions

Adobe Creative Cloud device licences are again available to our students for an annual subscription. The cost for 2019 will be \$13. The purchase of this software is optional. Please remember that Adobe Creative Cloud is not for iPads, nor Android devices, although some mobile apps are available.

Adobe has introduced a new scheme for students called "named-user licences" and reduced the cost considerably.

A named-user licence includes all the latest Adobe Creative Cloud desktop apps. It includes all the latest Adobe mobile apps, including Capture CC and Photoshop Mix. The licence also includes file sharing and syncing.

The Adobe software programmes that we use in the senior school include Photoshop, Light Room, Illustrator, InDesign, Premiere Pro and After Effects. These are the current industry standard programmes for designing work for print, web and moving image.



A student may install the software on a laptop and on a machine at home, but only use Creative Cloud on one computer at a time. There is no need to request two licences.

The School can only offer licences to our students with a school email address, not to families.

Adobe Creative Cloud is not

required, but access on a home computer provides students studying NCEA courses in Art Design, Photography and Media Studies with a significant advantage. The software is also useful for many other subjects.

Payment for a 2019 subscription will need to be made before Friday, 8 February, 2019. We will make the order according to payments made. The best option is to use online banking for the \$13 payment to this account:12-3029-0300684-00. Please make sure you include references as follows: **Student Name** and **Adobe**.

This will help you avoid queues at the start of the school year. You may also pay at the Finance Office when it is open during term time.

Students can access and use all Adobe software programs on their laptop or home desktop computer for 12 months. The licence is for Windows or Mac Computers. It is not available for Android tablets, nor iPads. Those with Adobe Creative Cloud in 2018 will need a new subscription if it is still required in 2019. The 2018 subscription expires soon after Friday, 8 February 2019.

This offer is available to all students at Mount Albert Grammar School. Although this offer is in place to assist senior students, junior students also wanting to have an Adobe Creative Cloud annual subscription may do so.Please remember that this software is not suitable for iPads.
