Despite the delayed start to the academic year, it is encouraging to see how quickly our students have settled into the business of learning.

We were delighted to receive notification of the success of MAGS students in the 2022 New Zealand Scholarship Examinations. A total of 118 NZ Scholarships were gained by our students – only three schools in New Zealand achieved a better result!

Special congratulations goes to our 2022 Girls Dux – **Deboprana Mallick** – who is one of only 11 New Zealand Premier Award

Winners. Deboprana achieved Scholarship in seven subjects – three of these at 'Outstanding' level. Deboprana will travel to Wellington to personally receive her Premier Scholar Award from the Prime Minister.

2022 Boys Dux **Wesley Donald** along with **Karen Zheng** also gained 'Outstanding Scholar Awards', which place them in the top 70 students in the country!

Oustanding Scholarship results



2022 Girls and Boys Dux Deboprana Mallick and Wesley Donald, pictured with Professor Peter Phillips, were among our best performers in Scholarship exams.

MAGS students have delivered some of our best Scholarship results, with our 2022 Girls Dux Deboprana Mallick winning a Premier Award and 2022 Boys Dux Wesley Donald being named an Outstanding Scholar along with Yujia Karen Zheng (pictured right).

They were among 15 MAGS students who gained Scholarship Awards (worth \$2000 each year for up to three years) and whose names will go up on our Honours Board in the F.W. Gamble Hall. All together, MAGS students gained 118 Scholarships with 15 of those at Outstanding level, placing MAGS fourth in NZ.



Deboprana's Premier Award places her among the top 11 scholars in the country and is worth \$10,000 a year for up to three years of tertiary study.

She earned Outstanding Scholarships in Calculus, Earth and Space Science and Economics; and Scholarships in Chemistry, English, Physics and Statistics.

Wesley and Yujia Karen are among the top 70 scholars in the country and their Outstanding Scholar Awards are worth \$5000 a year for up to three years.

Wesley earned Outstanding Scholarships in Statistics and Calculus; and Scholarships in Chemistry, Physics and Geography. Yujia Karen earned Outstanding Scholarships in English and Chinese; and Scholarships in Physics and Calculus.

Our other Scholarship Award winners were Alexandra Barker (Biology, History, Classical Studies), Anatol Coen (French, Physics (O), Calculus), Emma Cook (Dance, Economics, History), George Cooper (English, Biology, History), Max Davison (Biology, Calculus, Geography, Religious Studies), Nishera Gnanendra (English, Statistics, Religious Studies), Greeshma Kasuganti (Biology, Statistics, Religious Studies (O), Geography), Yasmin Lakeman (Biology, Statistics (O), Calculus), Alan Li (Physics, Calculus, Accounting), Oliver Tang (Earth & Space Science, Statistics, Calculus), Eva Wadsworth (Biology (O), Statistics, Health & Physical Education), Vivienne Hei Man Wong (Statistics, Calculus, Accounting).

Year 9s kick off school year



About 700 excited Year 9s had their first day at MAGS on Tuesday as the school year finally got underway.

The Year 9s gathered in the Albertian Quad before entering the F.W. Gamble Hall and being greeted with a haka by Te Puna o Wairaka students as part of a pōhiri led by Matua Pete Walters.



Teacher Leti Maupese, who is starting in the PE and Health Department this year, spoke on behalf of the new staff, while Dave Murdoch (brother of former Deputy Principal Tom Murdoch) spoke on behalf of new parents. He has a daughter who started as a Year 9 that day. Headmaster Mr Drumm welcomed the new staff and students, saying everyone was

excited about beginning a new school year and building on the strong traditions of the first 100 years of MAGS.

After they were assigned mentor classes, Peer Support leaders helped the Year 9s to get to know each other and guided them around the school grounds.

Before lunchtime, the Year 9s had their first assembly where they were informed of MAGS' values and guided through the school hymn by Albertian Tali Meavale. They were also introduced to Year 9 Deans Chris D'Souza and Jignesh Keshoor (pictured above), and Deputy Principals Sarah Hayes and Toby Powell, who are responsible for the Junior School.

Touch rugby coach honoured

Congratulations to our Premier Mixed Touch Coach Peter Walters (Te Rarawa, Te Aupōuri), who has been made an Officer of the New Zealand Order of Merit

Mr Walters has coached, played and developed touch rugby all over New Zealand and across 31 countries, raising the profile of the sport and developing skills, knowledge and resources. He is the founder of Galaxy Touch Club, established in Auckland in 1987, which is the largest touch rugby club worldwide with more than 120 teams in 30 cities and 14 countries.

He is the most capped player in touch rugby, representing New Zealand in nine World Cups and winning three. He has been a member of 35 winning national championship teams, with 20 consecutive gold medals for Auckland. He received the Coach of the Year award



at the Māori Sports Awards in 1999 and the Tohu Motuhake in 2011. Mr Walters received a Lifetime Achievement Award from Touch New Zealand in 2019.

Footballer in Word Cup qualifier win

Congratulations to James Ray (pictured right), who was part of the NZ squad that won the Oceania U17 World Cup Qualifiers in Fiji last month to progress to the U-17 FIFA World Cup in Peru in November.

NZ won all their games in the nine-team tournament and took out the final 1-0 against New Caledonia.



Rowers' medal haul at club champs

A gold-medal winning row in the Women's Club Coxless Pair Oars was one of four medal finishes for MAGS at the North Island Rowing Championships.

Lily Curnow and Olivia Tattersfield held the lead throughout the 2km race at Lake Karapiro, winning the A Final in a time of 7:46.84, ahead of a strong field including Hamilton Rowing Club in second and Petone Rowing Club in third.

This year's North Island Rowing Championships attracted more than 2060 competitors from 39 clubs and 54 secondary schools across New Zealand.

In the Men's Club Coxed Four A Final, the MAGSROW crew won silver, with Luke Sanders, Max Jarvie, Fraser MacGillivray, Ethan Green and cox Hamish Toogood.

MAGS rowers also put in medal-winning performances in the Men's Club Coxless Pair Oars with Fraser MacGillivray and Ethan Green finishing third to take home bronze in the A Final, and Lily Curnow, Olivia Tattersfield, Ruby Schmulian, Nicole Nagaratnam and cox Guy Pinfold winning bronze in the A Final of the Women's Club Coxed Four.

Overall, MAGSROW crews, rowing as West End Rowing Club (WERC), qualified for 19 finals at the regatta, including 12 A Finals.

"It was a strong start to the year and it was great to see our rowers' hard work and training paying off," says James O'Sullivan, MAGSROW Assistant Director of Rowing. "It is always exciting to see our crews make the podium, and it was a real positive to see some strong finishes for the novice rowers in the squad in their first major national regatta."

Mr O'Sullivan, who previously competed with and coached the Blackrock College Rowing team and spent a year with Rowing Ireland as a Development Coach, is part of a strong MAGSROW coaching team taking over the squad from former Director of Rowing Alice Denyer.


