This week we acknowledged the outstanding academic achievement of our students in the 2018 NCEA and Scholarship Examinations.

There were 317 students awarded a Scholar Lion for gaining their NCEA Certificate endorsed with Excellence – our best ever result!

The bar was also raised to a new level with MAGS students gaining 114 New Zealand Scholarships.

Miriam Leonhardt was named as New Zealand's top female scholar and will travel to Wellington to receive her Premier Award from the Prime Minister. Jonathan De Pledge also gained first place across New Zealand in Physics.

Our Academic Honours Board will see 14 new names added to recognise students who gained three or more Scholarships.

Our Scholars Assembly was a celebration of our core business as a school. While striving for success across all of our four pillars at



MAGS, we must never lose sight of the primacy of the Academic Pillar.

Students must graduate from MAGS with qualifications that open doors to further study and vocations – otherwise everything else we have done is in vain.

MAGS boasts top female scholar

Mount Albert Grammar School congratulated Miriam Leonhardt on being the top female secondary school scholar in the country and celebrated its students achieving a record 114 Scholarships at its annual Scholars Assembly on Wednesday.

Miriam, the Girls Dux of 2018, is one of only 11 Premier Scholars in the country, with the other 10 all being male. She achieved Scholarships in seven subjects: Biology, Calculus, Chemistry, Earth and Space Science (Outstanding), German, Physics (Outstanding) and Statistics (Outstanding). Premier Scholars – those who achieve at least three Scholarships at Outstanding level – receive \$10,000 per year for three years towards their studies. The last time MAGS had a Premier Scholar was in 2006.

Boys Dux for 2018 Gary He and Proxime Accessit 2018 Jonathan De Pledge (pictured below), who gained the top mark in Physics nationwide, were also named Outstanding Scholars and their names will go up on the Honours Board along with Miriam's and the 11 other students who achieved three or more Scholarships.

Relay for Life oversubscribed



The popularity of Relay for Life at MAGS just keeps on growing and in just under two hours all 300 places available on the team had been taken.

Organiser Alayna Pulham says the 300 limit was set by the Cancer Society coordinator due to safety considerations at the Lovelock Track venue.

Miss Pulham said that so many people signed up that there is now a waiting list of more than 70 students.

She said, "This goes to show just how willing the Mount Albert Grammar School students are and how significantly some of them have been affected by cancer. This is a charity event and as such

the aim is to raise a large amount of money for the Cancer Society. Our goal this year is to match last year's total of \$100,000."

Miss Pulham said that in fairness to all students, if anyone pulls out of the team the next people in the order that they signed up will be sent an email to confirm they can now sign up. This email will be sent to their school email account.

The event takes place over the weekend of April 6-7, with sponsored participants walking or running as many laps of the track as possible to raise money for the Cancer Society. Since yesterday afternoon, when counting began, students have already raised \$7000.

Melbourne Victory to host Football Academy

Yesterday, MAGS hosted a training run for the Melbourne Victory, the most successful football side in A-League history.

Football Academy members watched the squad train and prepare for tonight's match against the Wellington Phoenix at Eden Park. And some of the Academy members will get a closer look at the team's set-up when they travel to Australia to play the Victory's Youth side at Easter. Director of Football Peter Smith has connections with some of the Victory staff and is hoping to build on that relationship to provide another Football pathway for MAGS' promising players.

Victory coach Kevin Muscat (pictured presenting Mr Smith with a team shirt) said the visit by the MAGS Football Academy team – Year 9 and 10 Boys from last year – would be the first time they had hosted a NZ school side. He said the Victory had just started its Youth development, with players from about age 15 being brought into the club's system, and they were looking to expand that to

Log-ins for Kamar Parental Portal

It has been brought to our attention that not all parents and caregivers have received their Kamar log-in details. These have been emailed out again today.

The <u>Parental Portal</u> allows you to check your financial statement and make payments, as well as look up other details such as your child's timetable, attendance etc. Please make sure you use your parental log-in – not your child's student one – as only this will allow you to check your financial status.

Student absence and leave

Some parents are still not following the correct procedures for notifying student absence and leave, which are outlined below:

Student absence

- Parents must notify the school on the morning of the absence. They may do so in the following ways:
 - By telephone: 09 846 2044 x 8142
 - By email: <u>attendance@mags.school.nz</u>
 - Via the school app: Free to download from the App Store or Google Play. Search for 'Mount Albert Grammar School'
 - By note to the Student Centre
- If a student's absence was not notified on the day they were away, they should bring a note explaining the reason for their absence on the day they return to school.
- The absence note must be delivered to the Student Centre.

Late to School

If a student is going to be late to School, the School should be notified in any of the ways listed above.

The student must visit the Student Centre on arrival at School to receive a Late Pass.

Applicants must either live, study, or work in the Albert-Eden area. No previous experience is necessary.


