This week we acknowledged the outstanding academic achievement of our students in the 2019 NCEA and Scholarship Examinations.

Three hundred and sixty students were awarded a Scholar Lion for gaining their NCEA Certificate endorsed with

Excellence - our best ever result!

Gaining an Excellence Endorsement requires students to achieve at least 50 credits at an Excellence Level. This is a significant challenge and the school congratulates the large number of senior students who reached this benchmark.

Our success with MAGS students gaining 104 New Zealand Scholarships places us in the top six schools in New Zealand. Highlighted within this group was our Boys Dux Adam Bateman (six Scholarships), who was named as a National Outstanding Scholar along with Thomas Brendolise, who gained First Place in



New Zealand for French and will be acknowledged at the Prime Minister's Awards in Wellington in May.

Our Academic Honours Board will see 10 new names added to recognise students who gained three or more Scholarships. Our Scholars' Assembly celebrates the primary pillar of our school. We pride ourselves on the breadth of a MAGS education but the ultimate measure of success will always be viewed through an academic lens.

Congratulations to all of our Scholar Lion recipients and their families. You have set the bar high for the 2020 cohort! And thank you to our MAGS staff, who have helped lift the achievements of our students to new heights.

Academic excellence celebrated



Jamila Chen followed in the footsteps of her sister Jessica to become the recipient of the June Gray Charitable Trust Tertiary Education Scholarship (worth \$2500 per year for three years), which was presented to her by June Gray Trustee Noeleen Taylor, pictured at left. Jessica was awarded the scholarship in 2016.

Many of MAGS' top academics returned to school on Monday to be recognised at the annual Scholars Assembly. Thomas Brendolise, who had the top mark in French nationwide, and our Boys Dux Adam Bateman (pictured right with Headmaster Patrick Drumm) – were both recognised as Outstanding Scholars following the 2019 NZ Scholarship exams.

To be an Outstanding Scholar, students must achieve three Scholarships, including at least two at Outstanding (O) level, or more than three Scholarships,



including at least one at Outstanding level in the same year to qualify for consideration. There were 58 winners of this award nationally in 2019 and these students gain \$5000 per year for three years.

Adam gained six Scholarships – in English, Biology (Outstanding), Chemistry, Physics, Statistics and Calculus; while Thomas had two Outstandings among his three Scholarships in English, French (O) and Biology (O).

As a Top Subject Scholar, Thomas will be invited to the Top Scholar Awards Ceremony held at Parliament. He also receives \$2000 a year for three years towards tertiary studies. Their names will be inscribed on the Honours Board along with the following students with three or more Scholarships: Jamila Chen – English, Biology, Calculus; Mitchell Shaw-Lewis – Physics, Statistics, Calculus (O); Tara Falconer – English, Design, Photography; Alexander Pullen – Physics, Earth & Space Science, Statistics and Calculus; Head Boy Eric Shen – English, Statistics, Technology (O); Stephen Stuart – Biology, Earth & Space Science, Statistics; Eva Williams – Dance, History, Health and Physical Education; and Vaibhav Nayyar – English, Statistics, Health and Physical Education.

Quin Walden set three records, including the Intermediate Boys 100m IM record in which two other swimmers also went under the old time.

Edie Ancell and Bowen Crawford also broke a record each, Bowen improving on his own

record in the Intermediate Boys 100m Breastroke.

The top swimmers are now aiming to continue their strong swimming at the Central Zone Champs next week.

Champion rower inspires next generation



Albertian and Olympic rowing gold medallist Shane O'Brien (pictured right) returned to MAGS yesterday to inspire the next generation of rowers. He spoke to MAGSRow members about what it took to reach the top in rowing and told the students that the discipline and commitment required could and should be translated to their academic studies and general school life. Mr O'Brien's gold medal celebration (pictured above him and the assembled group of rowers) is part of the montage of successful Albertian sportspeople that covers the walls of the refurbished Gym 1.

He was a Prefect at MAGS in 1978 and Rowing VIII captain in the same year, as



well as playing First XV Rugby. He won gold in the Coxless Four at the 1984 Los Angeles Olympic Games. Mr O'Brien also competed at the 1986 Commonwealth Games in Edinburgh, winning a silver medal in the Coxless Four and a bronze in the Eights. Mr O'Brien returned to teach at MAGS for a time, taught in England for 20 years, and is now Director of Jumeira English Speaking School in Dubai.



MAGS Football partners with Melbourne Victory



MAGS hosted a Melbourne Victory training run last year, with Football Academy members watching on.

Mount Albert Grammar School has been chosen by the Melbourne Victory Football Club to host a Pre Academy Centre in April.

As part of the Victory's drive to develop youth football, the Pre Academy Centre will visit MAGS on 22-24 April and will feature a number of the club's Academy Coaches from the Hyundai A-League and Westfield W-League programs.

The Pre Academy Centres in regional areas are for boys and girls aged 9-14 and provide insight and exposure to the club's Academy system.

MAGS' Director of Football Peter Smith was instrumental in ensuring this event took place. "Mount Albert Grammar School is excited to be establishing this partnership with Melbourne Victory, one of the most successful clubs in Australia with a rich history in developing young talent," Mr Smith said.
