Yesterday we received confirmation of our 2020 New Zealand Scholarship results, which further affirm the

academic heights our students scaled in 'a year like no other'.

MAGS students gained **121 NZ Scholarships** – our best ever result and placing us 4^{th} compared to other schools across the country.







MAGS' record number of Scholarships



MAGS students again delivered outstanding academic results with a record 121 Scholarships, including 15 at Outstanding level, in the 2020 NZ Scholarship exams. Last year's Boys Dux Matthew Somerville, Girls Dux Caitlin Mitchell (both pictured above), Proxime Accessit Eric Shen (left) and Woolf Fisher Scholarship winner Alex Pullen (right)



were standouts among the eight students who gained three or more Scholarships and will have their names inscribed on the Honours Board. Matthew, the first Year 12 student to be named Dux, gained five Scholarships in English, Biology (Outstanding), Earth & Space Science, Statistics (O), and Calculus; Caitlin gained four Scholarships in Chemistry, Physics, Statistics,



and Calculus (O); Eric amassed an incredible seven Scholarships in English, Biology, Physics, Earth & Space Science, Statistics, Health and Physical Education, and Technology (O); and Alex gained six Scholarships in English, Chemistry, Physics, Earth & Space Science, Statistics (O), and Calculus.

MAGS welcomed its 100th cohort of Year 9s on Tuesday with a powhiri in the FW Gamble Hall.

More than 500 Year 9 students arrived at MAGS, gathering in the Albertian Quad before being greeted in the hall.

Te Puna o Wairaka students performed a haka before Headmaster Patrick Drumm welcomed the newest Albertians and their parents gathered on the mezzanine floor. The students were then introduced to Mr Coghill and Ms Yang, the Year 9 Boys and Girls Deans respectively, who assigned them to their Mentor Classes before they met their Mentor Teachers and Peer Support Leaders, who showed them around the school (as pictured above) and introduced them to its systems.

Keep up to date with the School App

Keep up to date with the MAGS app – free from the App Store or Google Play. Search for "SchoolAppsNZ", and load the app on to your phone.

You can then search for and add as many schools as you want so you can receive alerts from multiple schools. MAGS parents can access school newsletters (under 'Links'), Daily Notices, the Kamar portal, teachers' contact details, and notify the school about absences.

If you are using the app to notify the school about absences, please load and use the child's Student ID Number as this helps to log absences more effectively.



On the app, parents and students can check the School Calendar and sync events with their own calendars, and choose groups about which they wish to receive alerts.


Students at all levels will be expected to bring their own device to assist with learning in the classroom.


Sign up for Swimming and Athletics champs
