The school year at MAGS starts next week, with Year 9s beginning on Thursday, February 2.


The rest of our students start school on Friday, February 3.

## **Sports Update**

## Medals at NZSS Athletics





Jirah Esekia (above left) and Ben Skelton (above right) were the standout performers for MAGS at the New Zealand Secondary School Athletics Nationals, with Jirah claiming gold and silver, and Ben a bronze in field events.

The nationals returned in 2022 after the cancellation in 2021 due to Covid restrictions. They were held in Inglewood from December 9-11, with six students representing MAGS. Five of those students attended the nationals for the first time. Athletes had to battle wet and windy conditions for most of the three days of competition. Jirah (Year 10) had an outstanding meet, winning two medals and breaking a long-standing school record. He came second in the Junior Boys Discus with a throw of 47.12m, breaking the School Intermediate Boys 1.25 kg Discus record that has stood since 1962. Jirah also won the Junior Boys Shot Put with a throw of 14.30m. This was 1.26m further than second place. In the process, he equaled the School Intermediate Boys record set in 2013.

Ben Skelton (Year 13 last year) competed in his last nationals, finishing third in the Senior Boys Discus, equaling his efforts in 2020. Ben threw an impressive 48.38m in his second throw that saw him claim bronze. Ben has contributed hugely to athletics at MAGS, attending the nationals every year (apart from the cancelled 2021 event). He also holds several field event school records across the three age categories over his time at school. Other students who competed were Elliot Kitchener (Year 12). After finishing 3rd in his Senior Boys 100m heat, he qualified for the semi-finals to have the 10th fastest time overall, narrowly missing the final.

Taya Lewis (Year 12) competed in the Senior Girls Javelin and Discus, finishing 10th and

13th respectively. Benjie Fairclough (Year 10) finished 2nd in his Junior Boys 300m Hurdles heat to qualify for the final. In the final, he ran a personal best of 42.19 to finish 5th. Oliver Mayers (Year 9) competed in both the Junior Boys 100m and 400m. He qualified for the 400m semi-finals after a competitive heat, finishing 12th.

Assistant Director of Sport Carlin Crossan said, "A special mention and thanks to all the students' parents who travelled to Inglewood to support. A big thanks goes to Sian John, who at short notice offered to manage the students and take care of logistics at the meet."

# Archers on target at nationals

The first week of January saw the National Archery Championships held in a damp and windy Cambridge.

MAGS archers did exceptionally well during the tournament, which is the peak New Zealand archery event of the year.



Phoebe Newcombe (pictured left) won two golds in the Matchplay teams, and a silver and a bronze from the Target and Matchplay individual competitions in the Under 16 Women's Recurve division. The team gold medals came from a first time pairing of Phoebe with an archer from Timaru.

Orion Elward won silver in the Under 21 Men's Clout competition, bronze in the

Target, and fought hard to make the bronze medal Matchplay final. He also won the Robin Hood trophy for closest arrow to the flag in the Clout event.

Nick Lees won gold in the Under 21 Men's Clout, silver in the Target and gold in the Matchplay. He was awarded the Junior Clout Championship trophy.

Lily Brislen, who led the archery team for MAGS as a Year 13 last year, won gold in the Under 21 Women's Target, bronze in the Open Women's Matchplay, and the Junior Women's Target trophy for the year.



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
