Water issue yesterday

The school would like to thank parents and caregivers for being understanding and accommodating about yesterday's early dismissal of students due to water being cut off unexpectedly.

The school had no choice but to release students at late notice because of health and safety concerns. Senior Leadership has been in direct contact with Watercare expressing grave concern about how this incident occurred and its impact on an onsite school community of approximately 3500 people.

We are working with Watercare to ensure this situation is not repeated in the future.

Coronavirus update

Advice from the Ministry of Education is that any student who may be at high risk of exposure because they have recently been to China or have been in close contact with someone confirmed with the virus is asked to delay the start of their school year for 14 days and voluntarily stay away.

As you will know from media reports, the situation concerning coronavirus is rapidly evolving internationally.

This is a new virus and its specific nature is currently unclear, however it appears that you can have the virus at an early stage and not be showing any symptoms. The incubation period is currently considered to be up to 14 days.

As always, anyone who is unwell should not be at school. Parents with a particular concern about any child are urged to contact Healthline at 0800 611 116 or their GP for medical advice. Healthline has translators and interpreters available 24/7 in 150 languages and they do have Mandarin and Cantonese speaking staff available.

Software available to students

Download the app to keep up to date



Keep up to date with the MAGS app – free from the App Store or Google Play. Search for "SchoolAppsNZ", and load the app on to your phone. You can then search for and add as many schools as you want so you can receive alerts from multiple schools.

MAGS parents can access Daily Notices, the Kamar portal, teachers' contact details, and notify the school about absences.

Parents and students can check the School Calendar and sync events with their own calendars, and choose groups about which they wish to receive alerts.

Success at NI Rowing Champs




At the North Island club rowing championships MagsRow competing for West End Rowing club won the Gold medal in the Intermediate Coxed Four.

Changes to swimming programme



Mount Albert Grammar School is restructuring its swimming programme.

This means more opportunities for swimmers whose focus is on team sports and fitness as opposed to competitive swimming.

The sessions will still mainly focus on swimming fitness and technique to supplement the student's sport-specific training but the additional time and space can be utilised as team/sport-specific training for water-based sports or recovery sessions for land sports. The school has four lanes available at each session offered and has three session times available.

Session 1: 7:00 - 8:00am Session 2: 5:00 - 6:00pm Session 3: 6:00 - 7:00pm

All sessions run Monday to Friday and are only available to MAGS students at this stage. The fees are \$75 per month for three times per week fitness squad. This will stay the same with an option of \$100 per term for students only wishing to do two sessions per week (recommended for students not doing water sports or looking for light fitness training only). An additional charge will occur for students wishing to do more than the three sessions.

A Belgravia membership is also required to enter the pool. This is \$11.90 per week and allows access to the pool at any time.
