

Huge turnout for Blood Donor Day




Yesterday we held our annual Blood Donor Day, and it was great to see the NZ Blood Service back at MAGS after missing last year due to lockdown.

Nurse Claire Brown said, "On the day, we had a fantastic turnout with 128 people attending and 93 donations made – our highest number of donations in five years.

"To put these numbers into perspective: one unit of blood can save up to three lives, meaning that with yesterday's donations MAGS students and staff will save up to 279 lives. She added, "The NZ Blood service have commended the students and staff for their generosity in donating, and the impeccable behaviour observed on the day.

"They passed on that the students were a pleasure to work with and made the day thoroughly enjoyable. The tireless work from the Health Committee with spreading the word, recruitment of donors leading up to the day and organisation on the day itself contributed immensely to the success of the day – thank you for all your hard work."
