Gala Evening tickets selling fast




Make sure you are in quick to grab your tickets with only a week to go before the MAGS Art Show Gala Evening next Friday (July 28), starting 6pm.

Adi, a former New Zealand U19 rep, was a consistent performer for the Aces in the Super Smash, claiming seven wickets and producing match-turning spells.

At MAGS, Adi was a member of the 1st XI Boys Cricket team for five years and Captain in 2020. He also won the top school award for Most Outstanding Boy in an Individual Sport, Most Consistent Hockey player for the 1st XI Hockey team in 2020 and top awards in Cricket for three years in a row.

Students and parents are warmly invited to the MAGS Careers Expo next Tuesday (July 25).


To accommodate the Careers Expo next Tuesday, school will finish at 2.10pm. Students will have no Mentor Class time but all their usual classes.

Jacob Miller wins international science award



Congratulations to Jacob Miller (pictured above right on arrival home), who was part of the medal-winning New Zealand team who competed at the 34th International Biology

Olympiad (IBO), in the United Arab Emirates.

Jacob, who won a silver medal, which is a first for MAGS, went one better than last year when he won bronze.

He was part of a NZ team that achieved international success against 1000 students from 80 countries. Jacob was one of two New Zealand students who were awarded silver medals, with the other two in the team claiming bronze.

Reflecting on the success of students at the IBO, NZIBO Chair Dr Angela Sharples said: "The ambitious target for New Zealand is for our students to compete against the best young scientists in the world and bring home both the medals and a lifelong passion for the biological sciences that will grow science research and innovation in NZ. To win four medals is an outstanding achievement by our students. They are truly among the best young scientists in the world."

Tāwharanui tree planting



On Sunday, July 2 a group of 18 volunteers representing the MAGS Environment Group participated in a tree-planting day at Tāwharanui Regional Park, north of Auckland. This tree-planting day is held in conjunction with Auckland Council and volunteer groups, with the aim of reintroducing native plants to this important reserve. The park is a predator-free zone, home to kiwi, takahe and wētāpunga.

Our MAGS group worked in challenging conditions, on a steep and muddy slope on a rainswept coastline, to help plant over 1000 trees. These were all native trees, mainly manuka, kanuka and kahikatea.

Out-of-zone enrolments for 2024


The Mount Albert Grammar School Board of Trustees may approve a limited number of out-of-zone enrolments for 2024.

Applications for out-of-zone enrolments for 2024 must be received by **4.00pm, Wednesday, 30 August, 2023**. Should a ballot be required for out-of-zone enrolments, this will occur on Wednesday, 6 September, 2023.

Out-of-zone applications use the same online application procedure as in-zone students. However, out-of-zone applications do not require the completion of the in-zone Statutory Declaration Form or provision of proof of residence.

Orienteering Boys' sixth straight NZ title



The National Secondary Schools
Orienteering Championships in Blenheim saw the Boys team win the National
Schools title again and the Girls match their best-ever third place result.
Over the Term 2 break, 30 MAGS
Orienteers took part in three days of racing.

The Boys won the national title for a sixth year in a row and by a record-breaking 222 points, the points difference being more than that amassed by runners-up Cashmere and third-placed Auckland Grammar put together.

The Girls performed well on Day 3 to nudge into third place ahead of Havelock North.



In the Long Distance, on an exceptionally hilly course in the Marlborough Hills, there were Individual wins for Tahi Harris in the Junior Boys and Sam Carryer in the Senior Boys. In the Sprint distance, held in the busy streets of Blenheim town centre on Matariki, there was a win for Sam Carryer in the Sprint, with a second place for Tahi Harris. There was also

a strong fourth place for James Milne in the Intermediate boys race and an excellent 8th for Ella Edwards in the Senior Girls.

On the final day Relay event, MAGS had wins for the Junior Boys (Reuben Bruce, Charlie Milne, Tahi Harris) and second places for the Intermediate Boys (James Milne, William Wood, Reuben Adye) and Senior Boys (Luka Johnson, Matthew Greenwood, Sam Carryer).



Brothers strike gold in Gymnastics



Henru, Janko and Eras Viljoen came back with a haul of medals from the Gymnastics National Championships in Tauranga during the first week of the school holidays. Among some great results, Henru won gold in the 13-14 Double Mini Trampoline. Janko Viljoen won gold in the Men's Artistic Gymnastics Team Level 6 and in the 13-14 Synchro Trampoline. He was second in the FIG 13-14 Individual Trampoline and in the FIG 13-14 Double Mini Trampoline. He was fourth overall in the Men's Artistic Gymnastics Level 6

Eras won a slew of national medals and trophies, among them gold in the FIG 15-16 Double Mini Trampoline and the Men's Artistic Gymnastics U17 Parallel Bars. He won the Junior International Men's Double Mini Trophy (FIG 15-16 & 17-21), and the Junior International Men's Overall Trampoline Trophy (FIG 15-16 & 17-21).

Theo Bray and Eras took out the FIG 15-16 Synchro national title.

And Eras, with his NZ teammates, also took out the gold in the Trans-Tasman Challenge against Australia in Double Mini Trampoline.
