MAGS has hit the ground running in Term 3 with 3 Way Conferences (above) and Year 8 Information Evenings (below) this week.

The 3 Way Conferences, held Wednesday and yesterday, have produced an impressive attendance rate of around 96% as students discuss their progress with their Mentor Teacher and parents, and plan for finishing off the year in a strong fashion.

Deputy Principal Ms Hayat said, "This fantastic result demonstrates how our community is keen to work alongside the school. The 3 Way Conferences provided an important opportunity for teachers, students and parents to acknowledge student progress, achievement and next steps. They are a valuable avenue to involve parents and students in

the learning process, whilst strengthening our relationships with whanau."

The Year 8 Information Evenings saw the FW Gamble Hall packed out on both Tuesday night and last night as prospective students and their parents learned about the MAGS experience.

The finals were held during the school holidays at University of Auckland, with Alan and Deboprana (pictured right) our top performers, coming ninth and 10th respectively in the Senior division.



The NZPMC aims to help young scientists to extend their interest in Physics and Mathematics using a test format where they tackle a wide range of problems, rather than a competition that involves extensive research or a project.





Sports Update

Orienteers clean up at NISS and Nationals



At the NISS and National Orienteering Champs over the recent school holidays, Molly McGowan won all four Senior Girls titles across the two championships. Molly (pictured at centre above and at right) won the Senior Girls Sprint and Long events at North Islands and at the National Schools Championships in Auckland. Team Manager Neill McGowan said, "Winning all four titles is a fantastic achievement for Molly and rare in recent Orienteering history. In the NZSS races, she held off strong competition from Orienteers who were fresh from their return from Junior World Championships in Portugal.

"She won the Sprint by nearly three minutes and the Long by nine minutes at NISS, and then won the NZSS Sprint by a tight three seconds and then the Long by 22 seconds. She takes this form into the Australian Schools Championships as she represents New Zealand in Victoria next month."





Molly's achievements were part of a team effort that saw MAGS Orienteering Boys take out the North Island's Top Secondary School for the sixth year in a row as well as winning the Premier School competition.

The Girls finished third for the third successive year with a huge gap to Diocesan in 4th place (197 points behind). The Boys took out an Auckland Grammar team by 66 points, with Pukekohe a distant third, to maintain their dominance over the last few years. As well as Molly's victories, there were wins for Callum Wishart (Senior Boys – Long), Sam Carryer (Intermediate Boys – Sprint), the Senior Boys Relay and Intermediate Boys Relay.

In the second week of the holidays, the team then went on to the National Secondary Schools Championships.

Again they were supreme, winning the Top Secondary School for the fourth time in a row and the Premier School competition again. The Boys came out on top again, beating an Auckland Grammar team by 74 points, with Havelock North in 3rd. The Girls finished third for the second successive year with Diocesan 195 points behind. On top of Molly's wins, there was a victory for the Intermediate Boys Relay.

Upcoming Premier Sport



Today, our Football Boys 1st XI are away to Auckland Grammar at 6pm, while the Basketball Premier Girls and Boys play at home against Carmel and Rosmini respectively at 6pm and 7.30pm.

On Saturday, our Netball Premiers face Auckland Girls Grammar at 11.30am at Auckland Netball, while the Rugby Boys 1st XV have a tough away game against Kelston Boys High at 2.30pm.

On Monday, the Hockey Girls 1st XI play away to St Cuthbert's at 3.45pm, and the Rugby Girls 1st XV are also away, to One Tree Hill College at 4pm.

On Wednesday, the Football Girls 1st XI have a home game scheduled at 4pm (against the winner of Macleans College v Diocesan College), and the Hockey Boy 1st XI are up against Rangitoto College at Auckland Grammar at 5.45pm.

On Thursday, the Lacrosse Premier Girls have a semifinal game scheduled at 4pm with the draw yet to be released, and the Hockey Girls 1st XI are back in action, playing St Mary's at Baradene at 6.45pm.
