
## Form class photos distributed

The Mount Albert Grammar School Board of Trustees may approve a limited number of out-of-zone enrolments for 2024.

Applications for out-of-zone enrolments for 2024 must be received by **4.00pm**, **Wednesday**, **30 August**, **2023**. Should a ballot be required for out-of-zone enrolments, this will occur on Wednesday, 6 September, 2023.

Out-of-zone applications use the same online application procedure as in-zone students. However, out-of-zone applications do not require the completion of the in-zone Statutory Declaration Form or provision of proof of residence.

It was a superb win and they richly deserve it."

On Wednesday, the Auckland Secondary Schools Duathlon took place at a new venue, Ambury Regional Park in Mangere.


Students did the run leg on the roads through the park and the cycle leg on neighbouring streets.

The highlight of the day was Theo (pictured top) winning the Intermediate Boys race by 30 seconds. Theo took the lead in the first run leg. At the transition for the 2nd run leg after the cycle, he was in 4th position. A strong second run leg saw Theo overtake all three boys who were in front of him for the win. Theo has made a strong showing in a number of events this year, which also included a third place finish in the triathlon at the start of the year and first in the Central/West Zone Cross Country. decided.


#### James Dougal flying high
