One Of Our Earliest Navigators



Manuia le Vaiaso o le Gagana Samoa

This week we acknowledge our Samoan community at MAGS with the celebration of Gagana Samoa – Samoan Language Week.

Our MAGS Pasifika student community numbers more than 800 young people with approximately half of these identifying as Samoan. One need only look at our Honours Boards to appreciate the role Samoan students have played in the story of MAGS.

While many of our Samoan families began their association with MAGS in the 1970s and 1980s, the name of one of our earliest Samoan Albertians can be found on the Honours Boards from the mid-1930s.

Andy Kronfeld was School Swimming Champion from 1934-1936. Shortly after leaving school, he joined the Royal New Zealand Air Force and then the Royal Air Force, eventually flying a Spitfire during World War II. The aircraft was named 'Western Samoa' in acknowledgement of the funds raised by the people of his original

Andy Kronfeld was a navigator. His skills as a pilot allowed him to return safely to New Zealand after the war. As well as successfully navigating the skies, he was able to steer his way among the very different cultures in which he found himself throughout his lifetime.

URBAN MUSIC GROUP


Calling all rappers, singers, songwriters and music producers.
