Resetting the Academic Finish Line



Tena koutou ki te whanau o Mount Albert Grammar School.

The recently announced <u>changes to</u> <u>NCEA</u> for the 2020 year have been welcomed by schools.

The changes include the ability of students to be awarded 'additional' credits based on the credits they achieve during the current year. The

threshold for Level and Subject Endorsements has been reduced as has the requirement for University Entrance.

The rationale for these changes is clear and consistent. They offer compensation for lost learning time and are designed to be easy to understand and implement while maintaining the integrity of the qualification for our students.

Senior students will now be able to adjust their academic targets for the remainder of the year. Coupled with the calendar change to the exam period (now commencing 16 November) there is confidence that the impact of the lockdown period will have minimal effect on overall academic learning.

The challenge now for students is to put a full-stop to the events of the past 10 weeks and use wisely the significant time remaining in the academic year.

We have great confidence in the resilience of our MAGS students – and their ability to be successful this year!
