Records tumble at Athletics Championships



Five records fell at the 2018 Athletics Championships at Mt Smart Stadium, with Hannah Houghton (pictured above) breaking two of them - the Senior Girls 1500m and 3000m. She ran 5:07.33 for the 1500m, and 10:37.26 in the 3000m.

The other record-breakers were Max Brooke Cowden – 100m Senior Boys – 10.96s, Malia Seko – Junior Girls Long Jump – 5.20m, Luke Clements – Junior Boys 3000m – 9:55.72.

Max's 100m record is significant in the history of the school as he is the first boy at MAGS to break the 11-second barrier. The time makes Max the fastest U20 student in the country over 100m so far this year.

This was the biggest Athletics Championships in recent years with 400 students competing over a range of events.



As we settle into the term, the following general reminders are given to all:

• **Safety**: Students must remember to make safe choices about the routes they walk when coming to and leaving from school. Students are advised to walk in small groups and not to take shortcuts when walking alone.

- Behaviour: Walking in groups is encouraged but everyone must please be aware of other
 pedestrians and traffic. While it is easy to get distracted when talking to friends, students
 must make sure to watch where they are going and that they give way to others. Good
 manners and respect for others are important to our MAGS Way values.
- St Lukes Mall: Students should not be in uniform at St Lukes Mall unless they are accompanied by a parent.
- **PolyFest**: Only students competing at PolyFest are allowed time off school on the day of their events. All other students are welcome to attend on Saturday.
- **Traffic:** Parents are reminded that Alberton Avenue can become a bottleneck for traffic at both ends of the school day. Vehicles are not permitted into the school grounds to pick up students. A pick-up location that is a sensible distance from the school gates should be arranged with your child(ren).
