There have been some great results for MAGS from Summer Tournament Week, which is starting to wind up.

The Futsal Junior Girls (pictured above with the Senior Girls) placed second, losing out 3-1 to Mt Maunganui in a close game. The Futsal Senior Girls placed fourth after a tight 2-1 loss to Queen Margaret College

The Futsal Senior Boys are still playing, with their placing yet to be determined. In Waka Ama, Marnie Toloa took Gold in the U16 Girls W1 250 and Marlin Toloa also claimed Gold, in the U19 Boys W1 250.

The Premier Volleyball Boys team finished seventh, beating Papamoa College 3-1 to end a successful championship. A highlight for the Boys was beating Auckland champions Rangitoto on Day One, 3-1.

Congratulations to Albertian Milly Clegg, who has been called into the Football Ferns squad to play Iceland and Nigeria in Turkey next month.

Milly, aged 17, left MAGS last year to pursue her football career with the Wellington Phoenix and has been named in the NZ senior squad for the first time after a breakout season for club and country, including goals at both the U-17 and U-20 FIFA Women's World Cups.

Shortly after the announcement, she scored twice for the Wellington Phoenix in the Women's A-League to seal a 3-1 win over Adelaide United.




### **Shakespeare Showcase next Monday**
