Learning next week will have a key focus on consolidating or revising the work issued under lockdown.

Students who may be concerned that they have fallen behind, or are worried about their grades, will have this time to hear from their teachers about any adjustments to topics and assessment.

Our teachers have been reviewing and planning possible changes to learning that may benefit our senior students across the remainder of the year.

Additional Supports:

- The New Zealand Qualification Authority (NZQA) has announced clear dates that will delay the start of the NCEA exams and as a school we want to work with our senior students to ensure they can confidently sit these assessments.
- Many co-curricular sports and arts events (tournaments and competitions) have been cancelled and this time will now be taken back for quality uninterrupted class time.



 Students will be released later this year for NCEA study leave in part due to the delayed NCEA exam start dates and for the opportunity for targeted teaching and revision.

The School's Senior Leadership teams says, "We are confident that our young people and their teachers, who have each shown great resilience while in lockdown, will get back up to

speed over the remainder of this term, Term 3 and Term 4. "We have the will and we have the time. "

Physio clinic open again

The Mount Albert Grammar School physio clinic – 09Physiotherapy – will be re-opening at Level 2 on Monday, May 18.

Their top priority is the health and safety of their staff and clients during this time, so there will be rules and procedures in place. During COVID-19 Level 2 there will be:

- Appropriate physical distancing
- Contact tracing systems in place
- Health and safety requirements, including the use of PPE and infection control
 measures
- Contactless booking
- Spraying of surfaces and beds with disinfectant after each treatment
- No linen or pillows
- Emphasis on clients sanitising on entry and exit

To book a contactless appointment, students and staff will need to enter the clinic if there is no one else booking inside and stand two metres back from the reception desk to organise a suitable time.

Medals at North Island rowing



While Maadi Cup was cancelled due to COVID-19, the rowers were fortunate to participate in North Island Secondary Schools before the lockdown. In a competition that attracted 1854 athletes from 99 clubs, MAGS made 10 A Finals, 6 B Finals, and 1 C Final. Two A Finals were converted to Silver medals, in the Girls U15 Coxed Four and the Boys U16 Coxed Four.

Also notable, was that MAGS made the A Final of every age group Eight.
