# Michael Fatialofa's 'miracle' recovery

Albertian Michael Fatialofa (2006-10) continues to make a remarkable comeback from a horrific spinal injury suffered during an English Premiership rugby match four months ago. Videos of him walking again have gone viral after he suffered a vertebrae fracture and spinal contusion while playing for Worcester against Saracens. Doctors have dubbed his recovery 'a miracle' after he was stretchered off the field and spent three weeks in intensive care.

Michael played in MAGS' 1st XV from 2008 to 2010. In 2010, he was captain of the team that won the Auckland Championship, the New Zealand Championship and the Moascar



Cup. He was selected for the New Zealand secondary schools team that year as well. From 2011 to 2014 he played for Southland and then returned to play for Auckland from 2015 to 2018. He also played for the Hurricanes from 2016 to 2018 with the team winning the Super Rugby title in 2016.

In 2018, he signed with the


Worcester Warriors (who he is pictured playing for in the photo at top). You can read a recent NZ Herald interview with the 27-year-old lock and see videos of his recovery <u>here</u> Michael is now walking 2km unaided and, once he has completed his rehab in an English spinal unit, plans to return to the family home in West Auckland.

His recovery is similar to that of Albertian Jack Ngametua, who was told he wouldn't walk again after breaking his spine in 1988 while playing rugby for MAGS.

Jack also had a long road to recovery but eventually he was able to play social badminton, and for the past 23 years has worked for the Auckland Badminton Association.

These days he works as their Stadium and Events Manager, and while he has had to flag the badminton recently, he says he can still get around by himself. You can read a Stuff story about Jack <u>here</u>

Jack's legacy lives on at the school: the trophy for the 'Best Tackler in First XV Rugby' is named after him.

Launched shortly after Voyager 2, in 1977, Voyager 1 explored the Jovian and Saturnian systems, making valuable discoveries in the outer solar system. Voyagers 1 and 2 are the

# Physio clinic open again

The Mount Albert Grammar School physio clinic – 09Physiotherapy – reopened on Monday.

Their top priority is the health and safety of their staff and clients during this time, so there will be rules and procedures in place. During COVID-19 Level 2 there will be:

- Appropriate physical distancing
- Contact tracing systems in place
- Health and safety requirements, including the use of PPE and infection control measures
- Contactless booking
- Spraying of surfaces and beds with disinfectant after each treatment
- No linen or pillows
- Emphasis on clients sanitising on entry and exit

To book a contactless appointment, students and staff will need to enter the clinic if there is no one else booking inside and stand two metres back from the reception desk to organise a suitable time.
