Scholarships are each worth \$5000 per year for three years and are granted to students who show strong academic potential and are also good all-rounders. They were presented by Chris Liddell's sister Dr Hilary Liddell, with brother John Liddell also in attendance at prizegiving.

Adam also won The FW Gamble Memorial Cup for Best All-Round Boy in Year 13 and was awarded a Gold Lion. Head Girl Takunda Muzondiwa won the Prefects' Cup for Best All-Round Girl in Year 13, and was re-awarded a Gold Lion.

Head Prefects Takunda Muzondiwa and Germain Hellriegel-White, who MC'ed the ceremony, gave their farewell speeches, thanking staff, peers and parents – and providing

some humorous insights into life at MAGS.

The top teaching awards were also presented. Year 13 Boys Dean Andy Belson received the Herb Towers Travel Prize for a professional development trip overseas. The school is reviewing which device is best suited for our students' needs.



Sports update



Racing last Saturday at Lake Pupuke, MAGSRow had a successful start to the season. Strong tailwind conditions in choppy water saw all the smaller boat events cancelled and many of the Novice events cancelled. Races were run over 1000m.

Our junior crews made a strong showing. Both the Girls Under 15 and Under 16 eights won their races. There were second places for another Girls Under 15 eight as well as three Boys crews: Under 15 Eight, Under 15 Quad and Under 16 Coxed Four. Another three girls crews finished in 3rd place in their races: the Under 15 Quad Sculls, Under 16 Coxed Four and the Under 17 Quad Sculls.

The next regatta will take place at Lake Karapiro on November 16/17 where the race distance increases to 2000m.
