
There is also a 'Whodunnit' murder investigation run by the Science faculty using the ASB MAGS Farm as a resource.

"They now need to ensure they complete the remaining three sections of the award before continuing onto Silver. They were all a credit to the school and the camp made for a great few days.




Centenary books on sale now
