Members of our MAGS Alumni gathered together this week in School House for our Annual Albertians Christmas Luncheon.

This gathering was significant on a number of levels, not the least that the luncheon was our first (and last) for the year with previous events being cancelled due to Covid.

A further piece of history was made with the election of Lisa Oakden (pictured below right) as the first woman President of the Albertians Association. Lisa herself was a girls' first-day student in 2000 and was featured on the front cover of *The Lion* magazine earlier in the year when we celebrated 20 years of girls at MAGS.

The Albertians Luncheon was a celebration of so much of what makes MAGS special. The people in the room represented the allimportant tradition that we rely on for certainty and purpose as a school.

But equally we know we must keep MAGS relevant for our current young people who are inheriting a very different world. This dual

perspective was so well articulated by Ryan Antia (Year 9) and Henri Blakely (Year 12) when they addressed those present.

These young men showed a maturity beyond their years and a real understanding of the value of tradition sitting alongside the need to constantly change and improve.

It was a great night despite missing a number of students,




particularly in the choir, who were unable to participate because of sports commitments. The concert programme also featured colour photos of the fabulous work by Junior Visual Arts students.

which was cancelled due to the lockdown.

Both students spoke about the sacrifices made by Albertians during the war and how that related to the school motto 'Per Angusta Ad Augusta (Through Hardship to Glory)'. That theme was reflected in the speech by Mr Drumm, who looked back on a year that proved the importance of teachers to students, and face-to-face learning versus virtual lessons.

Sports update

Cricket Boys 1st XI in T20 Final



The Cricket Boys 1st XI play Kings College in the final of the College Sport Auckland Premier T20 championship tomorrow.

The game will be played at Kings College despite both teams having dropped only one game and MAGS having beaten Kings in pool play last week. A quirk in the rules makes net run rate the deciding factor as to who hosts the final.

Director of Cricket Tony Sail says that after finishing third in the 50-over One Day Championship behind second-placed Kings in Term 1, it's widely recognised that the two best teams in Auckland will contest the T20 final.

He says, "Wonderfully led by NZ Under 19 World Cup player Adi Ashok, with solid support from NZ Under 19 training squad members Yahya Zeb and Umang Patel, the MAGS players are eagerly awaiting the challenge from a strong Kings College XI."

It's MAGS' first taste of finals cricket since 2017 and comes on the back of a good year from a well-balanced young side.

The game starts at 10.30am and will be live-streamed on CricHQ

Following the final, Adi Ashok, Umang Patel and Yahya Zeb will be playing more cricket as they have been selected for the Auckland squad for the Men's Under 19 National Tournament in Christchurch beginning December 16.
