Lisa is a great role model for the students, being passionate about rural life and agricultural work.



Spreading love with Christmas cards



When told that many people experience extreme loneliness over the Christmas period, Junior School students were keen to help to remedy this situation.

Students from 9MZS, 9KNA, 10SAL, 10 DNA, 10WOL, 10GRG, 10SLE and 10AHN created handcrafted Christmas cards filled with messages of love and kindness for the elderly and the lonely in rest homes.

English Teacher Mary Niulesa said, "All too often, today's youth are accused of being self-interested and driven solely by social media. However, a large number of our students clearly disproved that negative stereotype in their efforts over the last week.

"The levels of kindness and compassion that emanated from our students during the production of these cards was both



truly profound to witness and very empowering for the students. Through a simple act of kindness our students were able to demonstrate their true community spirit and this task allowed them to understand the incredible impact they can have on the world around them. This is the second year that students here at MAGS have joined with Sending Love to make a real impact in communities right across the country."

Sending Love started last year when Hannah and Jayden Rogers realised that many elderly in rest homes suffered greatly from loneliness. So, the Auckland-based mother and her five-year-old son wrote Christmas cards for the elderly in their local rest home. MAGS is excited to be able to host a seminar with John Parsons, New Zealand's leading authority on safeguarding children online.

On Monday, December 3, at 7pm in the F.W. Gamble Hall, Mr Parsons (pictured) will cover topics such as online grooming, sexting, damaged reputations, cyber bullying, reputation management, learning to repel and report, and future-proofing for employment.

Mr Parsons' message is clear: "Educating young people to understand the value of identity is the

first step to using ICT safely and ethically and therefore educating young people to respect and protect friends and family identity is the second step."

Student device use in 2019



In 2019, students at all levels will be expected to bring their own device to assist with learning in the classroom.

Full information about this is on our school website <u>here</u> Please note:

• We are aware that some families have purchased other devices for use at intermediate school. These will continue to be suitable as well, as long as they have a screen size of at

least 7.9".

- A mobile phone is not considered by the School to be a suitable primary device for learning, especially with regards to the creation of published work.
- A device which is more than three years old is usually not a good option for students. They
 are slower, cannot always update to the latest software and their batteries may not last
 the school day.

Adobe Creative Cloud 2019 Subscriptions

Adobe Creative Cloud device licences are again available to our students for an annual subscription. The cost for 2019 will be \$13.

Adobe has introduced a new scheme for students called "named-user licences" and reduced the cost considerably.

A named-user licence includes all the latest Adobe Creative Cloud desktop apps. It includes all the latest Adobe mobile apps, including Capture CC and Photoshop Mix. The licence also includes file sharing and syncing.

The Adobe software programmes that we use in the senior school include Photoshop, Light Room, Illustrator, InDesign, Premiere Pro and After Effects. These are the current industry standard programms for designing work for print, web and moving image.

A student may install the software on a laptop and on a machine at home, but only use Creative Cloud on one computer at a time. There is no need to request two licences.

The School can only offer licences to our students with a school email address, not to families. Adobe Creative Cloud is not required, but access on a home computer provides students studying NCEA courses in Art Design, Photography and Media Studies with a significant advantage. The software is also useful for many other subjects.

Payment for a 2019 subscription will need to be made before Friday, 8 February, 2019. We will make the order according to payments made. The best option is to use online banking for the \$13 payment to this account:12-3029-0300684-00. Please make sure you include references as follows: **Student Name** and **Adobe.**



This will help you avoid queues at the start of the school year. You may also pay at the Finance Office when it is open during term time.

Students can access and use all
Adobe software programs on their
laptop or home desktop computer for
12 months. The licence is for
Windows or Mac Computers. It is not
available for Android tablets, nor
iPads. Those with Adobe Creative

Cloud in 2018 will need a new subscription if it is still required in 2019. The 2018 subscription expires on Friday, 8 February 2019.

This offer is available to all students at Mount Albert Grammar School. Although this offer is in place to assist senior students, junior students also wanting to have an Adobe Creative Cloud annual subscription may do so. Please remember that Adobe Creative Cloud is not for iPads, nor Android devices, although some mobile apps are available.

The Steeplechase Shield



This shield was presented by RB Brown in 1927.

There was no RB Brown on the staff, nor on the Board of Governors and he cannot be found in class lists. He may have been a father of a boy at school or a benefactor.

The Steeplechase is now called the Cross Country. The class of each finisher was recorded and points allocated; the class with the greatest number of points was the winner for that year.

Once the shield was full in 1959, there was not a second shield. In 1960 no results were recorded in The Albertian. From 1961 on, the first six finishers were recorded for each of the Senior, Intermediate and Junior races, though the form classes were not recorded.

Back boundary gate closed
