Over 160 students across Years 11, 12 and 13 walked the stage in recognition of their academic prowess.

The success of our Year 13 students, in particular, was a triumph as they have battled significant disruptions during each of their senior years at MAGS.

I am very grateful to the tertiary organisations, Albertians and friends of MAGS who collectively provided almost \$600,000 in financial support and scholarships to our graduates heading into tertiary study.

For the first time in 100 years, trophies were presented to the duces of the school – Wesley Donald and Deboprana Mallick.

The Centennial Cups for Dux were kindly donated by Albertian and 1965 Dux Professor Peter Phillips (at left), who was on hand to present them, along with a significant monetary prize.

Senior Prizegiving

A highlight of our Senior Prizegiving on Tuesday was the inaugural presentation of the Centennial Cups for Dux to Deboprana Mallick and Head Prefect Wesley Donald. For 100 years MAGS has not had a cup to present to its Dux, something that Professor Peter Phillips has rectified by donating magnificent cups for the Boys and Girls Dux. Professor Phillips, an Albertian, was well aware of this anomaly, having been named Dux in 1965 at Senior Prizegiving, where he received some books while others were photographed with cups.

He was a guest at the prizegiving in the F.W. Gamble Hall to present the cups to Deboprana and Wesley.

Wesley and fellow Head Prefect Lucy Taylor (pictured right) were MCs for the event and also gave their farewell speeches, reflecting on their time at MAGS. There were also two musical items by our award-winning Centennial Choir.

In 2022, the prestigious Gold Lion was awarded to seven students: Molly Cavanagh, Nishera Gnanendra, Lara Grozev, Bella Houghton, Greeshma



Kasuganti, Tabea Leonhardt and Christopher Sykes. The Gold Lion is awarded to students who have gained all four lions – in Academia, Arts, Service and Sport.

C.P. Liddell Scholarships, worth \$15,000 each, were presented by John Liddell to Max Davison, Wesley Donald, Deboprana Mallick and Eva Wadsworth.

Our Boys and Girls Proxime Accessit for 2022 are Thomas Fairweather and Greeshma Kasuganti respectively. Greeshma was also the recipient of the Woolf Fisher Memorial Scholarship, worth \$3000 a year for three years, and The Prefects' Cup for the Best All-Round Girl in Year 13.

Real world economics



Last week, Albertian Daryl Collins (Dux in 1993 and Woolf Fisher Scholarship winner) spoke about the world of Business and Finance to a number of senior Economics students.

Daryl spoke about his time at MAGS, the challenges of representing the Bank of England as a regulator on the world stage during the global financial crisis of the mid-2000s, and the difficulties of his current job at the Reserve Bank of New Zealand (RBNZ). He said post-Covid issues included trying to offset the negatives impacts of record levels of inflation facing New Zealand and the world.

HOF Commerce Blair Gilbert said, "Daryl was particularly impressed with MAGS students' probing questions about the economy and the RBNZ role in ensuring price stability and reducing unemployment.

"The Commerce students were equally appreciative of Daryl giving up his time to come in and speak to them and making the subject of Economics come alive."


Order your Centenary book now
