# The Cost of a Quality Education

The costs associated with schooling and education in New Zealand have again been the focus of recent media interest.

Discussion has centred around the right of students to a 'free' education and whether parents should be further

supporting schools who wish to offer more than a base level learning experience for their sons and daughters.

At MAGS we pride ourselves on a learning environment that goes far beyond any basic notion of what a school may look like. The diversity of choice across our four pillars allows for every student to follow a pathway unique to their strengths and aspirations.

Creating a school such as MAGS has not simply happened by chance – and it certainly could not have happened by relying on funding from government sources alone.

Many parents and families have helped to build up our school through donations, community fundraising events as well as investing their time in the coaching and mentoring of our students. In doing so, they have created the school they want for their sons and daughters – a school the equal of any in New Zealand.

The ideological debate about whether schooling should be free in New Zealand needs to be put to one side. The reality is we can't have MAGS as we know it without the financial and human capital our parents provide.

Thank you to our families who continue to support the MAGS young person through donations, course costs and fees.

The cost of a quality education is significant – but it pales in comparison to the cost of our young people not reaching their potential!


In Curling, the four-person Mixed Team of Bryn Williams, Jack Millar, Lily Hardy and

### Te Wiki o te Reo Māori



As part of Te Wiki o te Reo Māori/ Māori Language Week, MAGS' staff and students have been introducing te reo Māori into the day-to-day routines of classrooms with help from Te Puna o Wairaka staff.

Te Puna students also presented to staff about the importance of correct pronunciation of names and their cultural and ancestral importance.

As pictured, the Physical Education department has introduced a Maori tākaro (play) unit into its Junior PE programme to provide opportunity for ākonga (students) to explore and experience games specific to Māori culture.

PE teacher Andrew Scaife said, "The main aim is to celebrate Māori and promote cultural and physical wellbeing. "The games celebrate the traditional aspects of Māori movement, and strengthen physical and mental agility. Junior ākonga have been thoroughly engaged in the games, encouraged to



use te reo Māori and it is proving to be a rich and valuable learning experience for both ākonga and kaiako (teachers)."


## **School House wins out**
