Swim team national champions



The MAGS Swim Team have won the NZ Secondary Schools Co-Ed Swimming Championships for the first time in the school's history.

The event, which ran from September 12-15 at Waterworld in Hamilton, attracted 733 swimmers from 160 secondary schools.

Swimming Captain Vasilina Shipilova led the 21-strong team to this inaugural victory in her final year at MAGS with strong personal performances including two Bronze medals, 10 Top 8 placings and was a member of the Gold medal-winning women's relay team.

FINA World Junior Swimming representative Brearna Crawford was also in devastating

form and rewrote the record books, smashing three NZ 16 Years records, one Auckland Open and four Auckland Age Group records as she collected nine individual Gold, and one Silver medal. House Boy and MAGS Academy's top male swimmer of the meet Quin Walden produced outstanding results on his way to winning Gold, Silver and Bronze medals. Quin achieved nine Top 8 national placings to lead the male points score for MAGS.

Anna McGowen, who trains with the Central City Swim Club, was the



youngest member of the team and won Gold and her first ever national title in the 13 Years 100m Backstroke.

Coach Paul Kent said, "The team came together beautifully to produce this outstanding result for our school. I have no doubt that we will look back on this event with very fond memories, and the swimmers should feel very proud of this achievement. Each team

Faolan Okan wins scholarship



Faolan Okan has been awarded a \$5000 scholarship as part of an internship with the Department of Conservation following the Finals of the Sir Paul Callaghan Eureka! Awards in Wellington last week.

On top of the scholarship, Faolan was awarded \$1500 for reaching the finals stage, at which he presented his talk: Ammonia Treatment in Wastewater: A New Approach.

While in Wellington he also took part in the Governor General's Young Science Leaders Forum.

The Sir Paul Callaghan Eureka! Awards competition challenges secondary school and tertiary undergrads to deliver a 12-minute presentation about how an application of science or technology will benefit New Zealand's economic, environmental and social wealth and well-being.

Spoken Word team impresses at finals

Last Saturday, the MAGS Spoken Word team competed in the sixth annual WORD – The Front Line Grand Slam.

While the team was unsuccessful in their bid to lift the trophy, they delivered powerful and articulate performances that brought audience members to their feet.

The team members (from left to right) – Abby Irwin, Matilda Clack, Takunda Muzondiwa and Vaibhav Nayyar – were selected by audition at the start of the year, and these students worked hard to write original material and polish their performances for each of the demanding competition rounds, as well as manage their studies.

Vaibhav was singled out for his solo piece, which addressed the issue of absent fathers, by judge and Children's Commissioner Andrew Becroft. In Judge Becroft's final comments to all contestants he described how, as a first time attendee at a poetry slam, he hadn't been prepared to be so moved and was impressed by the bravery and intelligence of the young people who took the stage.

He said that Vaibhav's message had resonated with him particularly due to his time working as a Principal Youth Court Judge. He described it as an "important poem" that deserved a wider audience. Abby was acknowledged by international slam poet Carrie Rudzinski, who described Abby's poem about the harassment young women face as part of their daily life as "fresh". She said that Abby's poem covered a topic that slam poets regularly traversed but that Abby's skill as a writer and performer were obvious and the message was worthy of repetition.

Spoken Word is a discipline that is growing steadily, both globally and nationally.



In 2019, WORD – The Frontline attracted 40 high school teams from around Auckland and was described by seasoned attendees as the strongest showing yet.

This information will help to improve health services and programmes for young people. A random sample from the




MAGS year groups was selected to take part in the survey, joining more than 50 secondary schools throughout the Auckland, Northland and Waikato regions.

The last day of student attendance for Term 3 is Thursday, September 26. Term 4 starts on Monday, October 14.


From the Archives



Our archivist, Brian Murphy, has been surveying the school grounds and cataloguing some of the fine specimen trees such as the handsome rimu (pictured right), near the main entrance.

The native was planted on Arbor Day 1940 (which was then celebrated on August 4), with a a group of be-gowned masters and the student body present (pictured above). Many mature trees around the school were planted on Arbor Day, and Mr Murphy has documented the provenance of some trees while the origins of many are unknown. You can read all about them here

Adithya toured Australia in July with the U19s for four one-day matches, and will join the 18-man squad in Lincoln for five one-day matches against Bangladesh, starting September 29.

The team is building for the ICC U19 Cricket World Cup early next year in South Africa.


