



Mr Brice said, "This is an advancement in our Health and Safety from the current Honda ATV. This is such an important part of agriculture: keeping our people in the industry safe. It is an amazing upgrade from our TM250 ATV, which has been an absolute workhorse for the farm. This new machine will help with



normal farm duties and also help do some of the smaller work that the tractor has been used for."

He said that Blue Wing Honda had also provided a demonstration model ATV for a week for students to complete their ATV training, meaning they are learning on an up-to-date model.

Mr Brice (pictured right with HoD Agriculture and Horticulture Esther Hancock) said, "We cannot thank Blue Wing Honda enough, and this is an example of how the farm development is progressing. 
Unfortunately, car parking will not be available on school grounds, however drop-off at the front of School House is fine.


In memoriam

Last week saw the passing of two distinguished Albertians: Assid Khaleel Corban OBE (1939-1944), former Mayor of Waitakere City and Albertian of the Year in 2002; and Allan Herbert Seagar (1958-61), a Commonwealth Games swimmer who features on the Sporting Honours Board.

Assid Corban (pictured right) was part of the pioneering Corbans wine-making family in West Auckland and was the Mayor of Henderson Borough from 1974 to 1989, and the first Mayor of Waitakere City in 1989. He was awarded an OBE in 1988.

At MAGS he picked up many Academic Certificates, and participated in Athletics,





When the Corbans winery site in Henderson was sold in 1992, it was purchased by the Waitakere City Council and has since been transformed into the Corban Estate Arts Centre. Assid had a love of fishing and shooting, and was passionate about orchids, serving as president of the New Zealand Orchid Society.

He passed away at age 93 and is survived by wife Miriam, his son and three daughters and their children.

Allan Seagar swam for New Zealand at the Perth Commonwealth Games (1962) and Kingston Commonwealth Games (1966), competing in Breaststroke, Backstroke and the Individual Medley. He just missed out on a medal at the 1966 Games, finishing fourth in three events.

At MAGS, he was swimming champion in 1961, and played rugby in 1958.

He was a top competitor and stalwart of the Piha Surf Life Saving Club and last year was awarded his 50 Year Badge, given to members who have dedicated 50 years of service to Surf Life Saving within New Zealand.


He was a highly respected Life Member of the club and long standing Active Reserve (Grey



Watch) Patrol Captain. He was also involved in setting up the club's Nippers programme and, as an experienced bricklayer, in the re-build of the clubhouse. He passed away at age 74 and is survived by wife Valerie and three sons and their children.

Guided by The Calendar



These two booklets are examples of what was simply known as 'The Calendar'.

Archivist Brian Murphy said they fitted into the top pocket of the uniform shirt. There was a light grey shirt for summer and a heavy navy shirt for winter.

The Calendar lasted from 1922 to 1978. It had school lists of various sorts, including class lists and rooms.

These copies are a gift of Nancy Prentice, daughter of Alan R. Prentice (1939-41). In 1939, A.R. Prentice was in Junior 3A, a class for clever young boys.

Reminder about absence and leave

Student absence

Parents must notify the school on the morning of the absence. They may do so in the following ways:

- By telephone: 09 846 2044 x 8142
- By email to the Attendance Officer: attendance@mags.school.nz
- \cdot Via the school app: Free to download from the App Store or Google Play. Search for 'Mount Albert Grammar School'
- By note to the Student Centre
- If a student's absence was not notified on the day they were away, they should bring a note explaining the reason for their absence on the day they return to school.
- The absence note must be delivered to the Student Centre.

Late to School

If a student is going to be late to School, the School should be notified in any of the ways listed above. The student must visit the Student Centre on arrival at School to receive a Late Pass.

Exeats for appointments

Where possible the student should bring a note to School to show their teacher at the time of leaving, enabling the teacher to release them from class.

A confirmation email or phone message to the Attendance Officer or Student Centre at the contacts above is also required prior to the time the student must leave School.

The student must visit the Student Centre to sign out before leaving the School grounds.

Requests for non-school related leave of one day or more during the school year must be addressed to the Headmaster, Mr Patrick Drumm, at least two weeks before the start of the proposed leave. Sports update

Brearna piles up the medals and trophies



Swimming sensation Brearna Crawford added to her already impressive haul of trophies this year when she broke a national age group record, set three Auckland age group records and won eight Golds, three Silvers and one Bronze at the 2018 NZSS Swimming Championships in Wellington last weekend.

She broke the 15yrs 50m Fly NZ record in a time of 26.98sec, and swam five overall best female times.

Brearna, in Year 11, is pictured with an assortment of medals and trophies she has won this year at events including the Auckland Age Groups, Auckland Open, New Zealand Age Group Championship, New Zealand Secondary School Championship, and College Sport Individual Champs and Central Zone Champs.

Now she has her sights set on the 2018 State Teams Championships starting on October 3 in Canberra, where she expects tough competition from the Australian swimmers. Next year, she aims to compete in the World Junior Swimming Championships in Budapest. She has also been talking to her parents about some alterations at home to accommodate the growing collection of silverware that she has been amassing since age 10.

At the NZSS Swimming Championships, MAGS had more medal winners in Edie Ancell, who took Bronze in the 14yrs 50m Freestyle; Michael Chapman, who won Bronze in the 14yrs 200m Fly; and Bede Aitu, who claimed Bronze in the 16-18yr 50m Breaststroke. The relay team of Edie Ancell, Eva Williams, Vasilina Shipilova and Brearna Crawford won Silver in the 4x50m Freestyle and Bronze in the 4x50 Medley.

There were numerous other top 10 finishes by MAGS' swimmers over the six sessions from September 13-16.

Swim coach Paul Kent said, "Congratulations to the entire MAGS swim team on some great results. The team looked really good and had a fantastic time at the meet. Now their focus shifts towards the NZ short course championships and State Teams."

And Bede Aitu (pictured) has been chosen to represent the Cook Islands at the 2018 Youth Olympics to be held in Buenos Aires, Argentina from 6–18 October, competing in the 50m and 100m Backstroke events. He will be the sole participant from all sports for the Cook Islands and will be the country's flag bearer at the opening ceremony.

Leading up to this, Bede competed at the 2018 Oceania Swimming Championships in Papua New Guinea, setting Cook Islands records in the 50m & 100m Backstroke and Breaststroke, and 200m Individual Medley.



Football U17s qualify for World Cup



Congratulations to MAGS footballers Luca Taylor and Hayden Aish, who are part of the NZ team that has qualified for the FIFA U-17 World Cup in Peru next year.

They qualified by beating Tahiti 4-1 in the semifinals of the 2018 OFC U-16 Championship in the Solomon Islands this week.

In the Final tomorrow at 4pm, they play hosts Solomon Islands, who beat them earlier in the tournament in group play.

Terrell Peita named in Māori U18 team






