Film Night is on Thursday, October 17 at 6.30pm at Event Cinemas, St Lukes. Tickets \$10 from the Finance Office.



Calcex team wins again



Our Mathematics students have won the Auckland East Calcex for a third straight year, with MAGS' other team claiming third spot.

These great results came in the face of strong opposition from Macleans, Pakuranga, St Kentigern, Botany and Ormiston high schools.

Mathematics teacher Michael Walden reports that this means that MAGS is still the only winner of this event, much to the frustration of the other schools.

MAGS' winning team was Logan Allomes, Minh Nguyen, Stephen Stuart and Junjian Zhang; and the third-placed team comprised Jamila Chen, Cole Hickey, Caitlin Mitchell and Adam Bateman.

The format of Calcex is a 30-minute mathematics quiz consisting of 20 questions. Each question is worth five points, for a maximum of 100 points. The winning team is the first team to reach 100 points, or the team with the most points after 30 minutes.

Former teachers up for music awards



Former MAGS music teachers Elizabeth Stokes (above left) and Benjamin Sinclair (above right) have been nominated for five New Zealand Music Awards as part of indie pop band The Beths.

Mr Sinclair, an Albertian, was an itinerant music teacher and Jazz Band director at MAGS, while Ms Stokes was a brass teacher before commitments with The Beths took over. Following the release last year of their debut album *Future Me Hates Me*, The Beths have been nominated for Best Alternative Artist, Album of the Year, Single of the Year (*Little Death*), Best Group and Breakthrough Artist of the Year.

Albertian Steve Bate (1991-94) is an adventurer and sportsman who has triumphed over adversity.

He has an incurable degenerative eye condition, retinitis pigmentosa, with just 10 per cent vision, but that has not stopped him from climbing mountains, winning a cycling Gold medal at the Paralympics, and taking part in endurance cycling events.

Steve, who was awarded an MBE in 2017, is also a motivational speaker.

Sports update

Luca Taylor selected for World Cup



Congratulations to Football First XI goalkeeper Luca Taylor, who has been named in the NZ squad for the FIFA U17 World Cup in Brazil next month.

The NZ U17s are based at Bezerrão Stadium – close to the capital Brasilia – where they play Angola on October 26 then hosts Brazil followed by Canada as they attempt to qualify from their group to make the knockout stages.

Luca was in the NZ U16 squad that won the Oceania Football Championship in the Solomon Islands last year to book their place at the World Cup.

Adithya Ashok back in NZ Cricket U19s

MAGS' Cricket First XI captain Adithya Ashok has been called back into the New Zealand U19 Cricket squad to play against Bangladesh later this month.

Adithya toured Australia in July with the U19s for four one-day matches, and will join the 18-man squad in Lincoln for five one-day matches against Bangladesh, starting on Sunday. The team is building up for the ICC U19 Cricket World Cup early next year in South Africa.



Bowen Crawford joins NZ Swim Team



Bowen Crawford leaves on Sunday to represent NZ for the first time at the 2019 Australia State Teams Championships.

The 40-strong NZ swim team will be training on the Gold Coast for four days before heading on to Canberra for a team-formatted competition between the Australian state teams and a NZ team.

Bowen was selected to swim the 50m, 100m and 200m Breaststroke events after winning two Golds and one Silver at the 2019 National Age Group Championships in March.

Snowboarding Boys claim Bronze



In what is thought to be a first for our school, the Boys A team won a Bronze medal at this week's NISS Snowboarding Championships at Mt Ruapehu.

MAGS' team left early on Sunday – at 3am – to get to the mountain and had a great day of practice in perfect conditions.

On Monday, there were two competitions: the Banked Slalom and the Slopestyle, with weather switching from clear and sunny to white-out.

Andre Pickering and Ronan Guthrie-Hoven reached the Slopestyle Final but due to the deteriorating weather they did not land their finals run.

However, with the team's solid results, it accumulated enough points to claim Bronze.


