The Comeback



Tēnā koutou, e te whānau o Mount Albert Grammar School.

The courage of our student community in returning to school this week has been great to witness and I congratulated them on that in my Headmaster's Message video today.

Close to 90% of students are back at school, signalling a vote of confidence

in the safety of the MAGS learning environment. This show of trust is a credit to the way our whole community has responded to recent events.

Over 85% of our students and staff acted on the call to undergo a COVID-19 test – that's almost 3000 people! With the resulting lack of evidence of any community transmission, students and staff have been able to move back into the classroom and resume teaching and learning as normal.

A key message to our students is about the importance of looking forward. The year to date may certainly have been one like no other, but we cannot change that. What we *can* influence is the remaining 10 weeks until NCEA Examinations begin!

That is more than enough time to ensure academic goals are achieved. Work habits must be underpinned by characteristics such as determination and commitment – traits that have always been highly valued at MAGS.

We've shown such resilience as a community to get to this point in the year – and now we need to finish the job!

We can do this!

Examinations:

Senior students in Years 11, 12 & 13 will be on examination study leave across Week 10 – 21-25 September. These prerequisite examinations are timetabled across the week Monday to Friday inclusive, and senior students have been supplied with the examination timetable to plan their schedule for the week.

Across this week, senior students are expected to be at home revising for these examinations and many will be completing portfolio/assessment work, unless at school sitting examinations or attending scheduled subject workshops/tutorials.

Junior students will finish the term on **Thursday, 24 September**.

Senior students will finish the term on whichever day they have their last exam scheduled in Week 10. For **some senior students** this will be **Friday, 25 September,** with only those students who have exams scheduled on that day expected at school.


